Philanthropist, idealist, humanist, architect and superlative photographer, REZA, as he is widely known, lives to shoot another day. No stranger to the dangers of conflict, REZA has been consistently capturing prize-winning images of scenes never-previously-recorded and bringing them to audiences all over the world for the last 30 years.

As a photojournalist for National Geographic since 1991, Reza has explored more than a hundred countries, photographing conflicts and revolutions, human catastrophes and beauty. His eyewitness accounts have been made widely available in other international media (e.g. Time Magazine, Stern, Newsweek, El Pais, Paris-Match, Géo) and also through books, exhibitions and documentaries that have been produced about him and his work.

As early as in 1983, Reza created photographic-training programs around the world - from refugee camps in war-torn countries to grim European slum suburbs. In 2001, he founded Aina World, a new-generation NGO dedicated to children's education and training women in the areas of communication and information technology.

After his *Memories of Exile* exhibition at the Carrousel du Louvre, he shared his humanitarian vision through various exhibitions such as *Crossing Destinies* at the Jardin du Luxembourg, in Paris, the *One World, One Tribe* exhibition in Bahrain among others in Washington D.C and the Parc de la Villette in Paris. The exhibition *War + Peace*, presented at the Caen Memorial Museum, was also the occasion for another major retrospective of his work.

Author of twenty-five books, winner of the "World Press Photo Award", a "Lucy Award" at the Lincoln Centre in New York and an "Infinity Award" from the International Center of Photography in New York, he was honored with the "Medal of Chevalier of the National Order of Merit and the "Missouri Honor Medal for Distinguished Service to Journalism" and granted the title "Doctor Honoris Causa" by the American University of Paris. Reza bears witness by capturing the turmoil of the world: "The world is my field of vision. From war to peace, like the ineffable moments of poetry, my images are serve as a testimony of our humanity as we follow the roads down which the world leads us."

Visual testimony is at the heart Reza and his team's work. We invite you to discover his accomplishments over the year 2011.

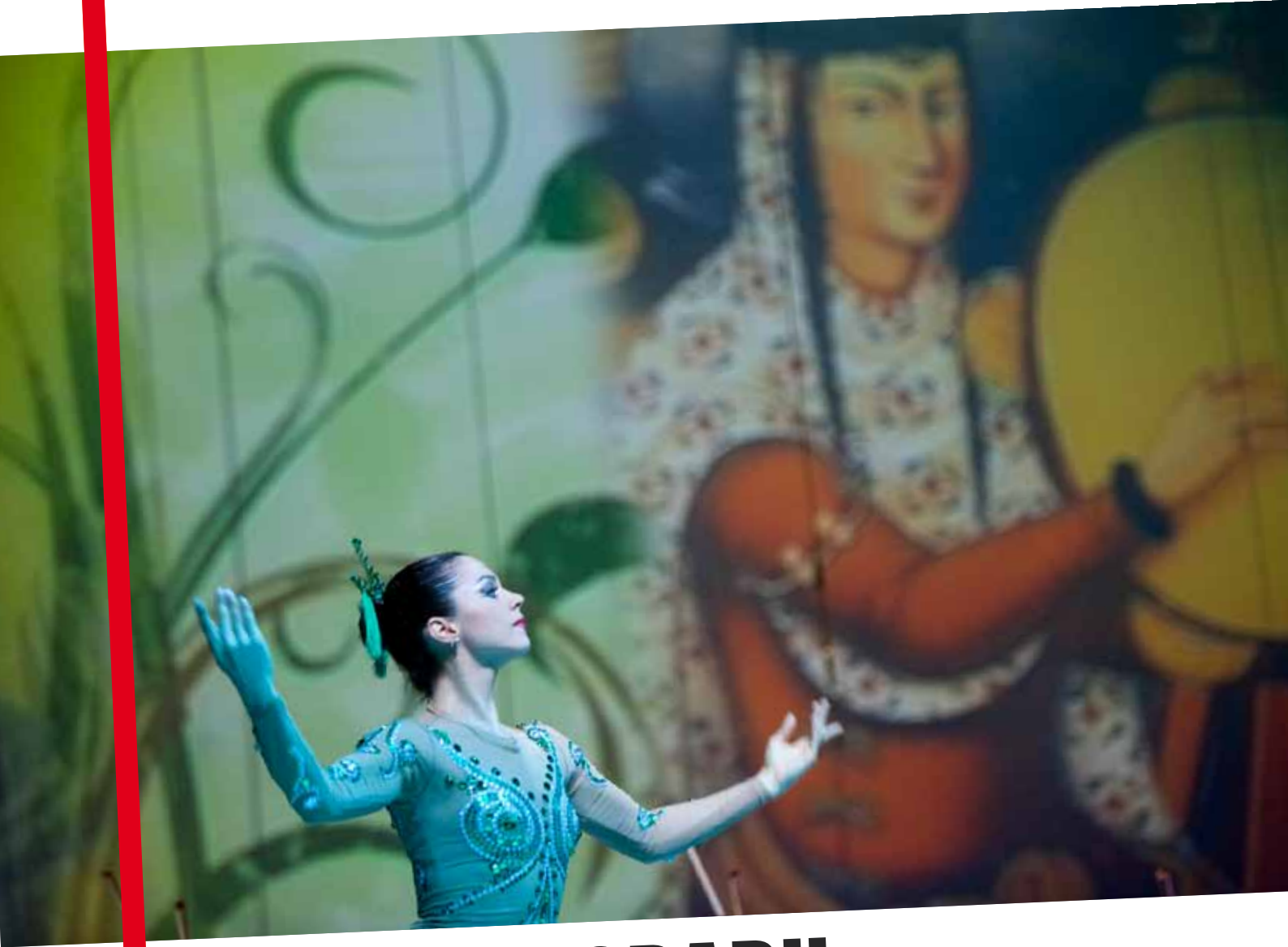

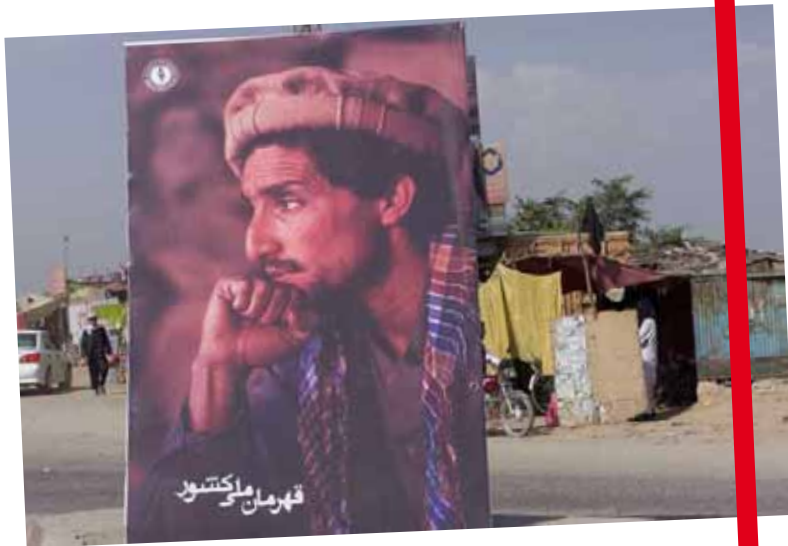

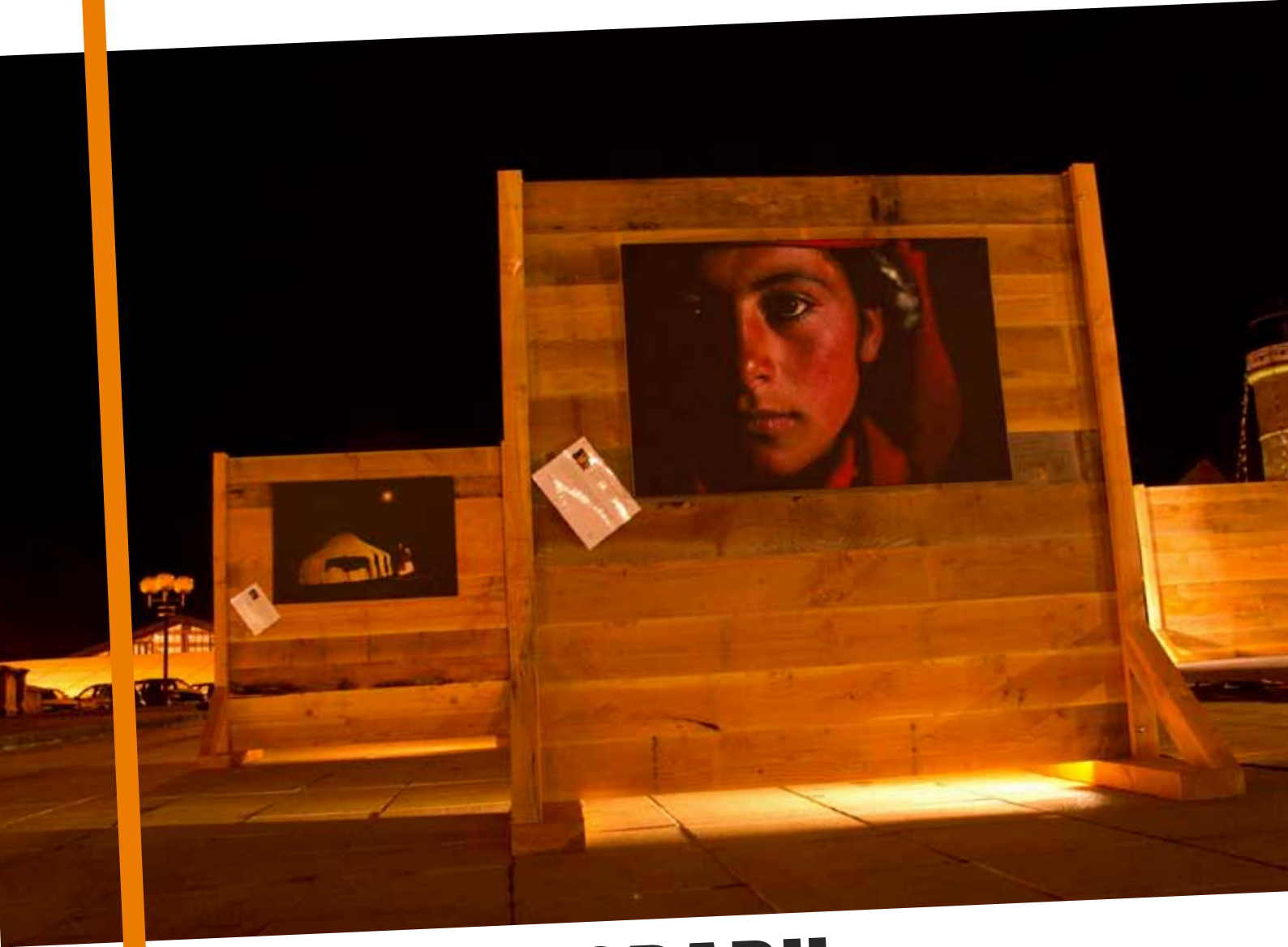
## Parade for the International Day of Worker Solidarity

I-Care Festival on fairness in tourism, in Brive-La-Gaillarde, France, November 2011

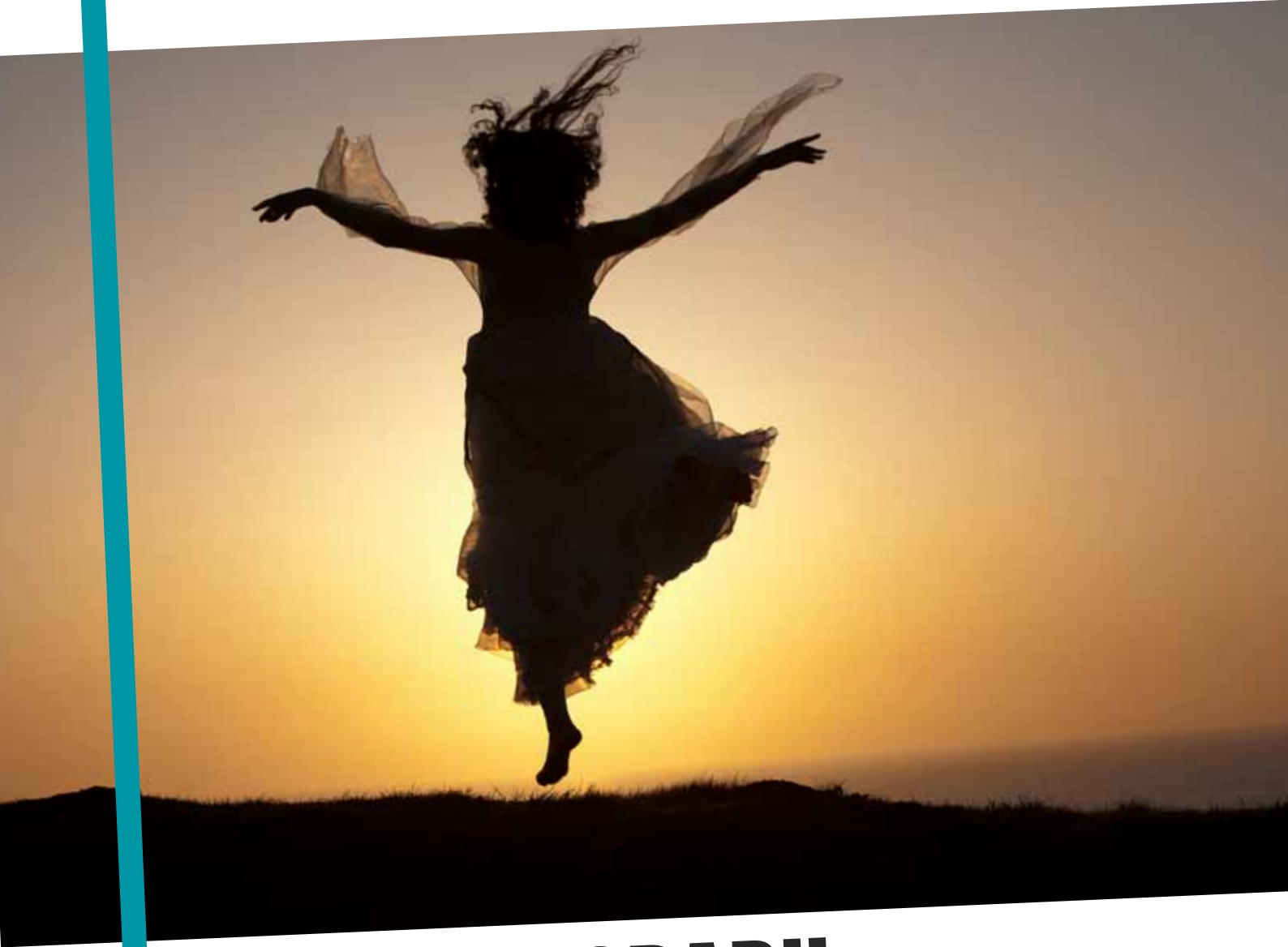

## Time in Turkey

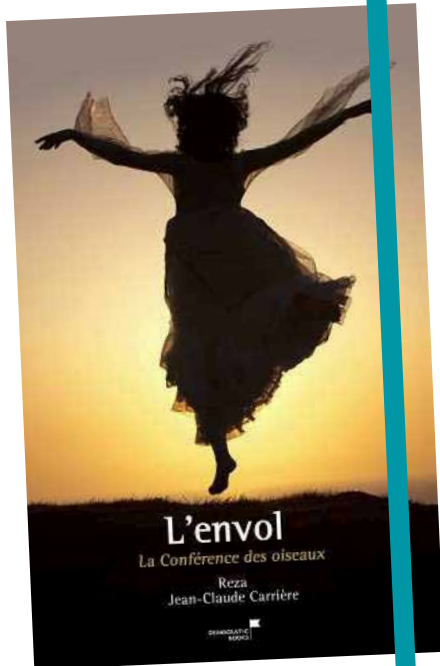
Group Exhibition, Istanbul, Turkey, 2011

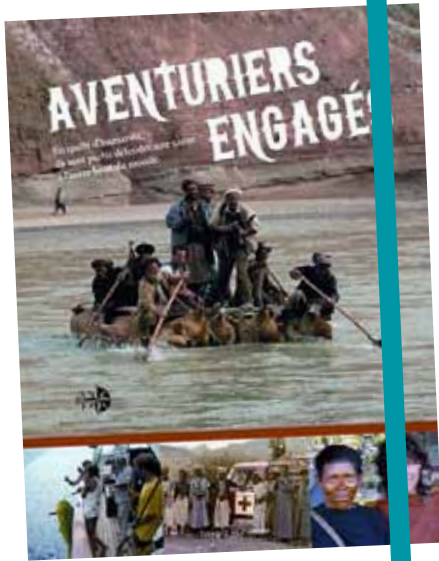
## Au pays des Mille et Une Nuits

A collective work, Editions Bayard, October, 2011

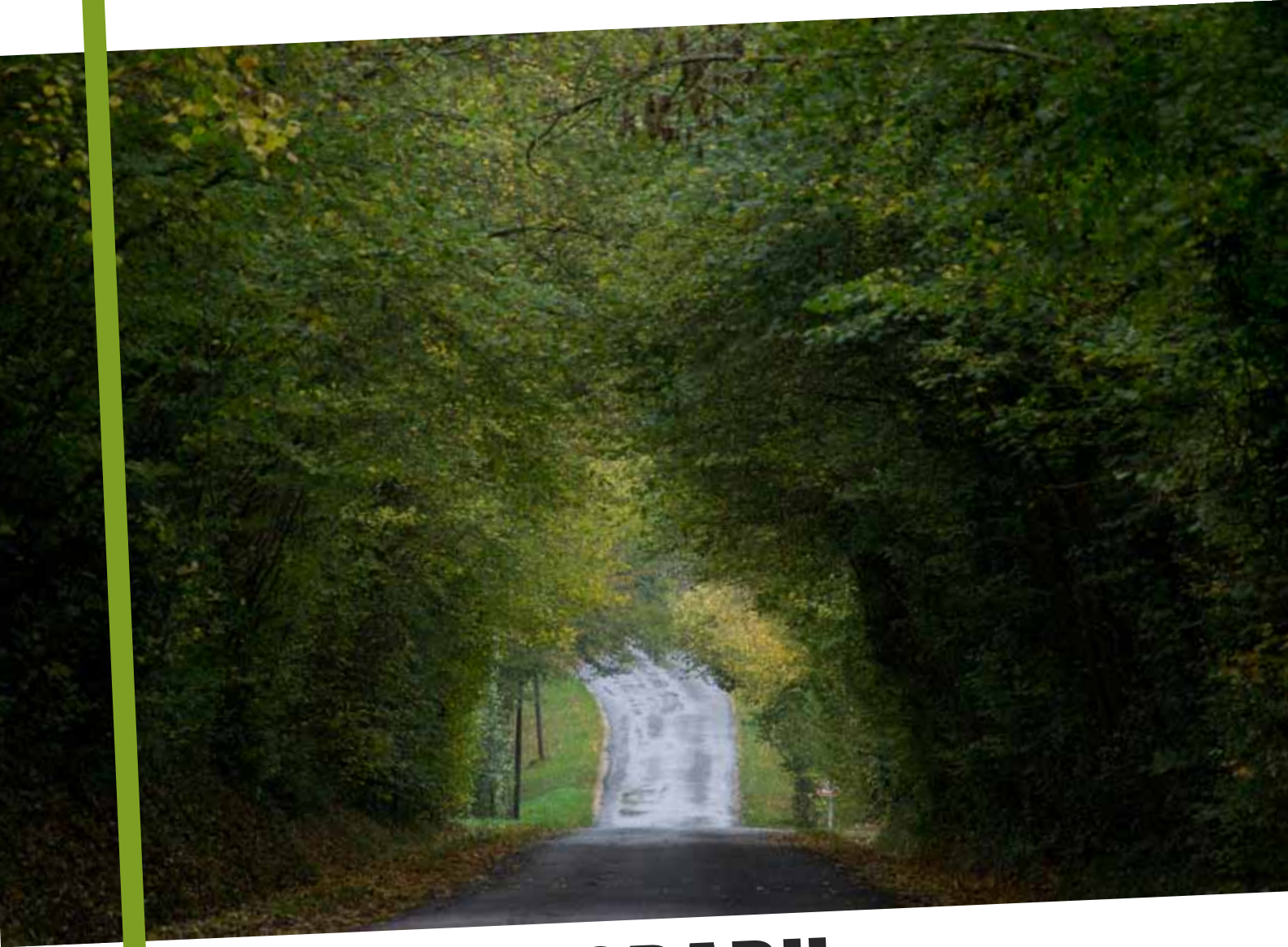

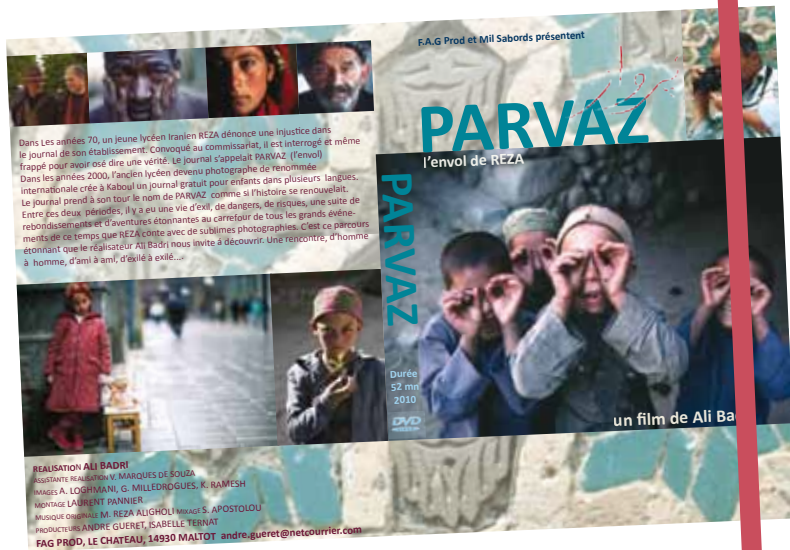

## Parvaz

The broadcasting of the 52minute documentary by Ali Badri on France 5 TV in March, 2011

For the programme «An evening with... Reza», France 5 broadcast the movie «Parvaz». The documentary retraces the genesis of the educational booklet of the same title, which means «the flight» in Persian, and which was launched in 2002 in Afghanistan by the NGO Ainaworld.

## Librino on Metropolis

Arte TV, France, April 2011

In Librino, a suburb of Catania (Sicily, Italy), Reza trains 100 young people in the language of the image through photography. A team from ARTE follows the students during a training session in their visual and human adventure for a broadcast on Metropolis.

## Afghan Warrior

National Geographic Channel, World, September 2011

As part of the commemoration of the death of Massoud, assassinated two days prior to the attacks of September 11, 2011, the National Geographic Channel France, broadcast the documentary «Afghan Warrior» (Reza : Derrière l'Objectif) produced as part of the series «Most Incredible Photographs.» It traces the return of Reza to the scene of his celebrated photograph of Massoud, taken 25 years previously.

## Afghanistan: 10 years, 100 looks

Arte Reportage multimedia platform, Web, October 2011

In commemorating the 10th anniversary of the assassination of Commander Massoud, Reza sought to participate in the web-documentary project carried out by Arte Reportage. Each month, it provides daily broadcasts of video modules created in-house by the Webistan Agency, by young Afghani filmmakers and the filmmaker Barmak Akram.



## Resistance

Uploaded on the 3<sup>rd</sup> October, 2011

In "Resistance", Reza shares memories of his deep friendship with the leader of the Afghan resistance. He brings a new perspective on the resilience of the Afghani people and the struggle led by Massoud and his men against the Russian invaders and later the Taliban.



## The Southern Drug Route

Uploaded on the 10<sup>th</sup> October, 2011

Through photographs and videos, "The Southern Drug Route" traces the drug route, a scourge at the heart of the Golden Crescent, from Afghanistan to Pakistan. Reza returns to the major economic and political stakes at play in Afghan society caught between culture and a descent into hell.

## At the Heart of an American Camp

Uploaded on the 17th October, 2011

The death of Massoud and the attacks on the World Trade Center in September 2001, unleashed the intervention of the American army in Afghanistan. In the heart of an American camp, in the tribal regions between Afghanistan and Pakistan, the images throughout the history described by Reza, bear witness to a real clash between cultures.



## The Culture of War

Uploaded on the 28th October, 2011

Throughout "A Culture of War", Reza, focuses on day-to-day life in a village whose economy is based on the production and sale of sophisticated weapons. There, the tradition of weapon making passes from father to son and the skilled hands of the children reproduce excellent firearms. A journey to the heart of one of the twelve Pashtouns tribes, the Afridis tribe.



## The Sorrows of Life

Uploaded on the 31st. October, 2011

In "The Sorrows of Life", the photojournalist Reza reveals some of his intimate visual and auditory memories of an Afghanistan scarred by decades of conflict. He talks about the war wounds of a population who, despite everything, are motivated by an unflinching hope for peace.

## AINA, Afghan and international current events

### The Flight from the Nest

The "Flight from the Nest" project foresees the merger of "Parvaz", the magazine for families, with a centre of the Afghan NGO, Aschiana.

"Parvaz" democratizes the access to education of a public previously excluded from the Afghan school system, in particular young girls, training them for careers in multi-media and the creation of new issues of the magazine. The partnership between Aina and Aschiana will perpetuate the project thanks to the creation of a Training Centre and the establishment of an editorial team.

2011 has seen the construction of the Aschiana building, which will soon be home to the new team from "Parvaz" and the Training Centre, become a reality. The current fundraising should enable the start-up of the project in 2012.

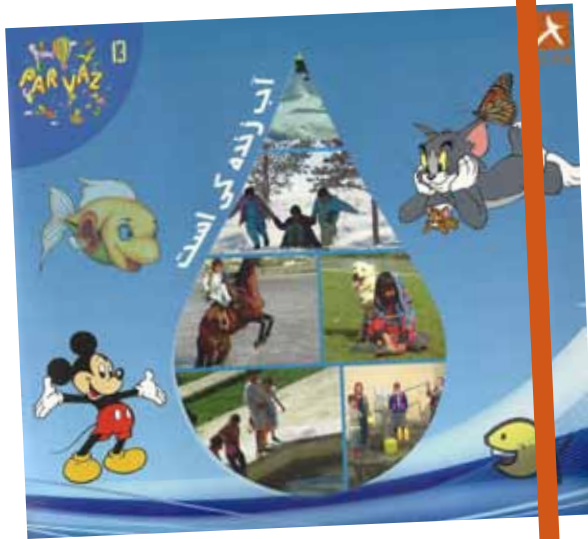

This magazine is one of the best educational tools available to Afghan families and teachers, with over 550,000 copies in circulation throughout Afghanistan. In the Autumn, a new issue on the topic of water saw the light of day.

## Exhibition of the work of Fardin Waezi, a photographer trained by the NGO Aina

British Museum in London, England in 2011

Fardin Waezi is one of the first photographers trained by Manoocher Deghati, Director of the Photography Centre and alongside Reza, co-founder of the Ainaworld NGO. In 2011, Fardin offered a fresh look at the life and culture of Afghanistan, as part of the exhibition «Afghanistan, Crossroads of the Ancient World» at the British Museum in London.

## Everyone is a changemaker

30th anniversary of the Ashoka Network in Paris, France, April 2011

In 2008, Reza was appointed a Senior Fellow of the Ashoka Foundation for his commitment to humanism and for the activities of Ainaworld. During the events organised to celebrate the 30 years of the existence of the network of social entrepreneurs, the association will be showing the documentary film «Afghanistan Unveiled».

The film follows the careers of women journalists trained by Aina, who travelled in the regions of Afghanistan to film the daily lives of Afghan women and to give them a voice. Presenting unpublished testimony concerning the end of the era of the Taliban and nominated for an American Emmy Award in 2005, the film was preserved in the archives of UNESCO.

## The 10th Anniversary of Aina

Held at the American University of Paris, France, September 2011

To mark the 10th anniversary of the Ainaworld NGO, the American University of Paris hosted an exhibition by Reza and paintings by the children of the Aschiana Afghan Association which were based on his photographs. A ground-breaking conference enabled a review of Aina's activities. Aina has worked for 10 years to restore a climate of peace and to establish a strong civil society in Afghanistan.

## Towards Internationalism - Photographer Reza

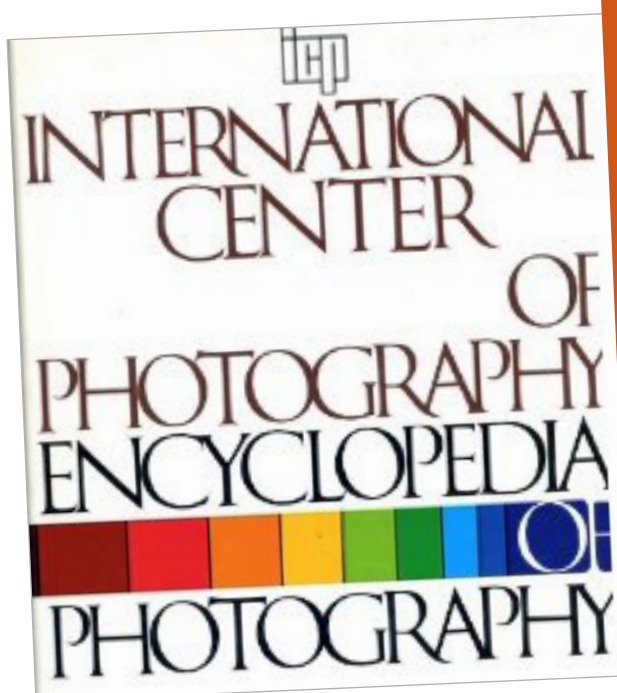


### The Librino Project

In partnership with the Fiumara d'Arte Foundation, Librino, Sicily, Italy; February-March, April, September & October 2011

In Librino, a disadvantaged suburb of Catania (in Sicily), Reza, with the support of the Fiumara d'Arte Foundation, is training 100 young people from Librino in the language of the image and in photography. Invited to take a fresh look at their environment, they have been carrying out their own reporting since 2009, basing their work on the theme "My Land, My Family".

2011 marked the end of these training courses, which will soon give rise to an open-air exhibition of Reza's photographs and the best images created by his pupils, in the suburb.



### Workshop and meeting with the educational team of the ICP

New York, USA, February 2011

To discover photography and share the universal language of the image remains a priority. In addition, Reza offers students at the «International Center of Photography» a training session and an opportunity to exchange their visual experiences.

## WPO Workshop

London, England, April 2011

As a member of the prestigious "Sony World Photography Organization" and, in 2010, President of a Jury for an international photographic competition launched by Sony and Unicef aimed at adolescents worldwide, Reza became involved with young talent who had been rewarded by Sony with private training courses. After a training course in Ethiopia, Reza will attempt to transmit his method of visual education informally in the streets of London.

## Terre universelle, Youth of the World in Concert

National Theatre of Toulouse, France, May 14th, 2011

Reza is sponsoring the event "Universal Land, Youth of the World in Concert", illustrating the show with photographs projected onto monumental screens. This initiative is supported by Ainaworld, whose activities in support of the principles of free speech are similar to those supported by the Youth of the World association.



## MAP Photography Festival in Toulouse

Toulouse, France, May 2011

In May 2011, Reza sponsors the MAP 11, Festival of Photography in Toulouse. A time for meetings between photography enthusiasts, the festival takes over the public areas of the pink city. Lined with pictures, Toulouse offers passers-by the opportunity to sharpen their gaze and to share their impressions.
